Are you up for the challenge?

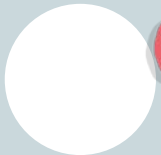

Instructions:

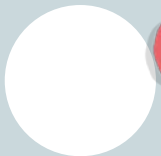

Solve the rhymes to find the location of the letter:



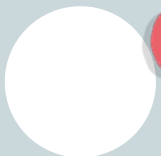
